## CONSIDER COLOURS

The right colours can elevate your photos

Consider the colours of both your outfit and your baby's outfit. 2 tips: very bright colours leave colour casts on skin, and dressing everyone in complementary colours can make photos feel more put together. Of course this is only a guide; there's no "dress code" and the most important thing is that everyone feels relaxed, comfortable and like themselves!



## MAKE SURE BABY IS WELL FED

A full baby is a happy baby

Try to time feeding or meals/snacks so your baby is eating just before I arrive at your house, or just as I arrive. Depending on their age and mood, your baby might need a feed, a drink, or a snack during the shoot, and that's fine! We can take as many breaks as your baby needs.



## EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED 1

Tiny adventurers

If your baby is crawling or walking, please don't be surprised if they don't want to stay still for long! Some little ones have no interest in the camera, and prefer to go off on their own adventure.

Action shots of a happy baby are much better than sitting still shots of a grumpy baby who doesn't want to be sitting still, so it's best to go into the shoot with an open mind and follow your baby's lead!



## EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED 2

Cute clingers

I will discuss with you in advance to try and time your photoshoot for when your baby won't be too hungry or tired, but if your baby is still a bit unsure and needs lots of cuddles during the shoot, don't panic! We can get plenty of great photos of your baby in someone's arms. If you think your little one might be on the cautious side, you may wish to be ready to get into some photos yourself, even if you hadn't originally planned to be in any.
